



SAINTS (1-1) TRAVEL TO OAKLAND RAIDERS (0-2) FOR PRIMETIME PRESEASON MATCHUP

With both starting units conducting one of their final tuneups for the regular season, the Saints (1-1) will travel to Oakland to face the Raiders (0-2) on Sunday to close out their 2011 preseason road slate. The contest will be played at the O.co Coliseum at 7 p.m CT and will be broadcast nationally on NBC.

The clubs' last preseason meeting occurred when the Saints beat the Raiders 45-7 on Aug. 29, 2009, as New Orleans set an exhibition record for points and margin of victory in a performance that gave confidence for a Super Bowl XLIV Championship campaign.

New Orleans will practice from Monday through Friday in Oxnard, Calif. to prepare for the preseason tilt. The Saints are seeking to clean up mistakes from their 27-14 loss to the Houston Texans on Saturday. The Raiders lost a 17-3 decision at the San Francisco 49ers on Saturday.

With QB **Drew Brees** at the controls for his team's first three drives on Saturday, he brought New Orleans inside the Houston five-yard line twice. On the final possession the starting offense was on the field, rookie RB **Mark Ingram** culminated a 12-play, 70-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown run, his second scoring rush of the preseason.

The running back trio of Ingram, **Darren Sproles** and **Pierre Thomas** combined for 16 carries for 82 yards (5.1 avg.) and two TDs.

QB **Chase Daniel** entered the game in the second quarter in relief of Brees and completed a pass to undrafted rookie wideout **Joseph Morgan** that was turned into a 56-yard gain into the end zone. In fighting for a roster spot, Morgan has shown a penchant for big plays in the preseason with Saturday's touchdown and a 78-yard punt return for a TD in the preseason opener.

THE COACHES

Saints coach **Sean Payton** has posted a 49-31 regular season record and a 4-2 postseason mark, guiding the team to the Super Bowl XLIV championship. He's the lone head coach in club history to open a season with 13 straight wins and post a 13-game winning streak, and has the franchise's top all-time winning percentage (.613). Over this period, the Saints have the best winning percentage in the NFC, fourth in the NFL. He's also the club's leader in postseason victories. Payton's 24-16 (.600) home record and 25-15 (.625) road mark are the top winning percentages in club records. Payton's recorded a 38-22 (.633) mark vs. NFC opponents. Since taking over, the Saints have the best record among NFC South teams over that period. In 2006, he took the Saints to the NFC Championship and was named the NFL Coach of the Year by most major outlets. Payton's only one of four coaches to lead his team to two conference championship games since 2006. Calling the club's offensive plays, the Saints are one of only two NFL teams to finish in the top 10 in yards per game each season since 2006.

Payton was hired as New Orleans' 14th head coach on January 18, 2006, after serving on the Dallas Cowboys staff from 2003-2005. Prior to joining the Cowboys, Payton served on the New York Giants staff from 1999-2002, including the final three seasons as offensive coordinator. His tenure was highlighted by a Super Bowl berth in his first full season as coordinator. Payton's prior NFL coaching experience came as quarterbacks coach for the Philadelphia Eagles from 1997-98.

Hue Jackson is the 18th head coach in the Raiders history. He served as Oakland's offensive coordinator in 2010 and has 25 years of coaching experience in college and professional football and has been a coordinator at both levels.

Prior to joining the Raiders, Jackson spent two seasons as Baltimore's quarterbacks coach and helped the Ravens advance to the postseason in 2008 and 2009. In 2007, he served as offensive coordinator for the Atlanta Falcons, after serving as wide receivers coach of the Cincinnati Bengals from 2004-06, where he oversaw two of the NFL's most prolific wide receivers in Chad Johnson and T.J. Houshmenzadeh. Prior to his stint in Cincinnati, Jackson enjoyed his first NFL stint as a coordinator in charge of the Washington Redskins offense in 2003 after previously serving as running backs coach. Jackson enjoyed his first stint as an offensive coordinator at California in 1996 and then served in the same position at Southern California from 1997-2000.

SERIES HISTORY

The Saints and the Raiders have met four times in the preseason, with the series split 2-2 overall. The regular season series is also knotted at 5-5-1. The Saints have played three of the most notable preseason contests in franchise history against the Raiders. On August 5, 1990, New Orleans played in Europe for the first time when they defeated the Raiders 17-10 at London's Wembley Stadium in the American Bowl. On September 1, 2005, they played their first game following Hurricane Katrina, a 13-6 loss at Oakland. On August 29, 2009, they defeated the Raiders 45-7, in a contest where their output and margin of victory was the biggest in Saints preseason history, a performance that many credited in setting a tone for the club's Super Bowl XLIV Championship campaign

LAST PRESEASON MEETING

Aug. 29, 2009: Saints 45, Oakland Raiders 7 @ Oakland Coliseum – QB **Drew Brees** completed 14-of-17 passes for 179 yards and drove the Saints to touchdowns on all three drives he played, leading New Orleans to a 45-7 win in the their highest preseason output and margin of victory in franchise history.

Brees completed his first eight passes. The return of last year's leading receiver, **Lance Moore**, from off-season shoulder surgery helped Brees' cause. Moore had four catches for 29 yards, including a 5-yarder in the back of the end zone on Brees' final pass.

Moore's touchdown gave the Saints a 21-0 lead with 13:53 left in the half and brought an early end to Brees' day. RB **Lynell Hamilton** got the bulk of the running work with 16 carries for 95 yards. **P.J. Hill** added 89 yards and two touchdown runs.

New Orleans added two more scores before half-time behind backup **Mark Brunell**, taking a 31-0 lead when Hill scored on a 1-yard run with 1:21 left in the half. That was set up by a 71-yard pass from Brunell to **Robert Meachem**.

The Saints outgained Oakland 344-60 in the first half, posting 19 first downs to three for the Raiders. New Orleans finished the contest with 536 yards of total offense.

OFFENSE

QUARTERBACKS (3) - Returners: Drew Brees, Sean Canfield, Chase Daniel. **WORTH NOTING:** Brees, the club's all-time passing yardage leader, threw for over 4,000 yards for the fifth consecutive season in 2010, passing for 4,620. One of five team captains, he also added 33 touchdown passes (tied for second in NFL) while leading the league's sixth ranked offense. At the conclusion of the 2010 season, Brees was the first Saint since WR **Joe Horn** (2000-02) to be named to his third consecutive Pro Bowl. Daniel returns for his third season with the Saints as Brees' backup. The former Missouri standout has seen extensive action in the preseason, completing 19-of-35 passes for 256 yards with one touchdown, one interception and four rushes for 19 yards. Canfield, the team's seventh round selection in the 2010 NFL draft out of Oregon State, was the club's third quarterback as a rookie and will compete for a spot on the club's 53-man roster.

RUNNING BACKS (10) - Returners: RB Jaiquie Bell, FB Jed Collins, RB Chris Ivory, RB Chris Taylor, RB Pierre Thomas **Off-season veteran additions:** RB Patrick Cobbs (UFA-Mia.), FB Korey Hall (UFA-GB), RB Darren Sproles (UFA-SD). **Draft choices/Rookie free agents:** FB Kolby Hurt (FA), RB Mark Ingram (D-1b). **Departures from 2010:** RB Ladell Betts, RB Reggie Bush, FB Heath Evans, RB Lynell Hamilton, RB P.J. Hill, RB Julius Jones, RB DeShawn Wynn. **WORTH NOTING:** After being hindered by an ankle injury in 2010, a healthy Thomas looks to bounce back with a productive 2011. While he's expected to start several members of the club's stable of backs can expect extensive action. Returning also is the club's 2010 rushing leader, Ivory, who finished 2010 with 716 yards and five TDs, while only starting four games. New additions include the team's second selection in the first round of the 2011 NFL Draft, former Heisman Trophy winner Mark Ingram from the University of Alabama. Ingram rushed for 3,261 yards with four touchdowns in three years with the Crimson Tide. He's score one touchdow apiece in each preseason game. Also join-

ing the roster is Sproles, who promises to be a threat in the running, passing and return game. He joins the Saints after spending the past six seasons with San Diego. No NFL player has more all-purpose yards since 2007 than Sproles' 8,260. Collins, who spent the 2010 season on the practice squad, and Korey Hall, an unrestricted free agent acquisition from Green Bay are competing for the starting fullback spot. Bell and Taylor return to the club and will look to impress on both offense and special teams as they try to earn roster spots.

WIDE RECEIVERS (11) - Returners: Adrian Arrington, Montez Billings, Marques Colston, Devory Henderson, Robert Meachem, Lance Moore, Courtney Roby, Andy Tanner. **Draft choices/Rookie free agents:** John Chiles (FA), Jarred Fayson (FA), Joseph Morgan (FA). **WORTH NOTING -** Colston, Henderson, Meachem and Moore again will look to lead this talented group of receivers for another successful year. Colston, ranked third all-time in most club receiving categories, recorded his fourth 1,000 yard season in five years while also adding seven touchdowns to lead the team in receiving. Henderson, who stretches the field as a deep threat, is New Orleans' all-time receiving average leader (18.6) and his 19.0 yards per catch since 2006 leads the NFL. Meachem, the club's first round draft pick in 2007, added 44 receptions for 638 yards and 5 touchdown grabs despite a nagging toe injury that he is fully recovered from following rest and rehabilitation. Moore added 763 yards on 66 receptions with eight touchdowns. His 22 career scoring grabs are ranked eighth in club record books. Arrington, a seventh-round pick in 2008, has shown promise in practices for the past three seasons and will look to break into the club's wideout rotation. Billings, Roby, who also handles kickoff returns and has excelled on the club's special teams coverage units, and Tanner will join the trio of undrafted rookie free agents Chiles, Fayson, and Morgan as they fight for the remaining spots and add youth and depth to the position. Morgan will make a run at the roster after a 78-yard punt return for a TD and 56-yard scoring reception in the preseason.

TIGHT ENDS (5) - Returners: Jimmy Graham, Tory Humphrey, Tyler Lorenzen, David Thomas. **Draft choices/Rookie free agents:** Michael Higgins. **Departures from 2010:** Jeremy Shockey. **WORTH NOTING:** With the departure of Shockey, Graham and Thomas are expected to headline the position. Graham looks to make even more of an impact in 2011 in his sophomore season. The club's 2010 third-round draft choice finished his rookie campaign with 31 receptions for 356 yards and five touchdowns while only starting five games. Thomas has helped in both the running game and passing game in two seasons in New Orleans and finished with 30 receptions for 219 yards and two TDs in 2010. Tory Humphrey has helped the Saints with his blocking in the running game. Lorenzen, a converted college quarterback, has opened eyes with his pass-catching abilities. Undrafted free agent, Michael Higgins, will compete for a roster spot.

OFFENSIVE LINE (14) - Returners: G/T Roger Allen, T Charles Brown, T Jermon Bushrod, G Brian de la Puente, G Jahri Evans, G Carl Nicks, T Zach Strief, C Matt Tennant. **Offseason veteran additions:** T Jordan Black (FA), T George Foster (FA), C Olin Kreutz (UFA-Chi.), C Cecil Newton (FA). **Draft choices/Rookie free agents:** T Dan Gay (FA), C Ryan Taylor (FA). **Departures from 2010:** C Jonathan Goodwin, T Jon Stinchcomb. **WORTH NOTING:** Three starters (Bushrod, Evans and Nicks) return to the line in 2011. Six-time Pro Bowl selection Olin Kreutz, who was lured away from Chicago in training camp, will replace the departed Goodwin and anchor the middle of the offensive line. Strief, a five-year veteran and seventh round draft pick in 2006, and Brown, the club's second-round choice in 2010, will compete for the starting nod at right tackle. Tennant will serve as a backup at both guard and center. The team's fifth round choice in 2010 saw action in all 16 games as a rookie. Veteran free agent pickups Black, Barron and Foster provide depth at tackle. Gay, Newton, and Taylor look to impress the coaching staff and gain roster spots on one of the most talented and productive offensive lines in the NFL.

DEFENSE

DEFENSIVE LINE (14) - Returners: DE Alex Brown, DE Jeff Charleston, DT Sedrick Ellis, DE Junior Galette, DT Mitch King, DT Swanson Miller, DE Will Smith. **Offseason veteran additions:** DT Aubrayo Franklin (UFA-SF), DT Tom Johnson (FA), DE Turk McBride (UFA-Det.), DT Shaun Rogers (FA). **Draft Draft choices/Rookie free agents:** DE Cameron Jordan (D-1a), DT Dexter Larimore (FA), DE Greg Romeus (D-7a). **Departures from 2010:** DT Remi Ayodele, DL Anthony Hargrove, DE Jimmy Wilkerson. **WORTH NOTING:** Smith, the club's 2004 first-round draft pick and a team captain, has registered 55 sacks during his seven-year career, fourth-most in club history. Smith, Brown, and Ellis are returning starters from a defense that ranked 4th in the NFL in opponent yards per game 2010. Alex Brown has appeared in 143 consecutive contests, the longest current streak for an NFL end. The Saints added a pair of run-stoppers to the interior of their defensive line by adding three-time Pro Bowl selection Shaun Rogers and Aubrayo Franklin in free agency. Franklin and Rogers are expected to form a three-man rotation with Ellis. All three have the ability to clog the line of scrimmage and rush the passer effectively. The Saints further bolstered their pass rush and run defense by drafting DE Cameron Jordan 24th overall and DE Greg Romeus in the seventh round of the 2011 draft. Jordan, drafted out of California, looks to contribute immediately. Garnering 16.5 sacks for the Golden Bears as an end in a 3-4 defense, the son of former NFL standout TE Steve Jordan possesses the versatility to play three of four positions along the line. Romeus has excellent size to go along with athleticism. Knee and back injuries cost him most of his senior season at Pittsburgh. He will continue to rehab, seeking to make an impact on defense and special teams. Ellis led the team in 2010 with six sacks and posted 78 tackles. Galette, a 2010 undrafted free agent, has displayed a burst off the line of scrimmage as he made the 53-man roster out of training camp and played in four games. Charleston plays a valuable role in the end rotation. Both he and Galette possess the speed and intensity to contribute on special teams as well.

LINEBACKERS (11) - Returners: Jonathan Casillas, Jo-Lonn Dunbar, Ramon Humber, Scott Shanle, Jonathan Vilma. **Offseason veteran additions:** Ezra Butler (FA), Will Herring (UFA-Sea.), Clint Ingram (FA). **Draft choices/Rookie free agents:** Nate Bussey (D7b), Dwight Roberson (FA), Martez Wilson (D3a). **Departures from 2010:** Stanley Amoux, Danny Clark, Marvin Mitchell, Anthony Waters. **WORTH NOTING:** Vilma, the quarterback of the New Orleans defense, enters his fourth season with the Saints and will lead a rising defense. In 2010, he led the Saints for the third consecutive season with 131 stops and chipped in a career-best four sacks as he became the first Saints linebacker to be selected to consecutive Pro Bowls since Pro Football Hall of Famer Rickey Jackson. Casillas enters the 2011 season with high expectations. In his first year (2009) as an undrafted free agent out of the University of Wisconsin, Casillas contributed greatly on special teams. Casillas was a strong candidate to take over the starting weakside role in 2010 before he suffered a season-ending foot injury in the preseason finale. Shanle and Clark rejoin the Saints after rounding out the starting lineup with Vilma in 2010. Shanle has played in 74 games during his Saints tenure since being acquired in trade in 2006 training camp, starting all but one of them and has recorded 562 stops during that period. Dunbar, who has played in 37 career games, has excelled on special teams in the past, but also has starting experience (13 games). He possesses the versatility to play all three positions. Fully recovered from knee surgery in the 2010 offseason that cut short his opportunities, the hard-hitting Ingram played for defensive coordinator Gregg Williams in Jacksonville in 2008 and could be a sleeper in the competition. Humber was a late season pickup and special teams contributor. Wilson was selected 72nd overall in the 2011 NFL draft and will push the veterans on the outside while also contributing on special teams. In the seventh round of the draft, the Saints selected Wilson's college teammate at the University of Illinois, Nate Bussey, who will seek to contribute right away on special teams, recording an interception in the club's pre-season opener.

Torrence filled in for numerous injured teammates in 2010, and contributes on special teams as well. Third round draft selection Patrick was a special teams ace at Louisville and will be expected to push on both defense and coverage units. At the beginning of training camp, the Saints added veteran depth by signing unrestricted free agent Fabian Washington. In six years with Oakland and Baltimore, this cover corner has recorded 204 tackles and six interceptions. Jenkins and Harper, slated to maintain their starting roles this season, are both coming off of breakout campaigns. Harper, the first safety in franchise history to be selected to two consecutive Pro Bowls, had 100 stops in 2010 with five forced fumbles and three sacks. Jenkins, entering just his third NFL season, was named *Associated Press* All-Pro second team in 2010 in his first season at free safety, when he recorded 82 tackles, two interceptions, and a club-best 11 passes defended. Prioleau and Reis have excelled on special teams and also provide valuable depth behind Jenkins and Harper. Jonathon Amaya, who was acquired from Miami via trade at the start of camp, led the Dolphins with 15 special teams stops as a rookie in 2010. Abdul-Quddus and McDaniel have impressed the coaching staff on special teams in training camp.

SAINTS HEAD COACH SEAN PAYTON

In just five seasons as Head Coach of the New Orleans Saints, Sean Payton's established himself as one of the most successful coaches in the NFL. Since coming to New Orleans, Payton has led the Saints to their first Super Bowl title in and two division titles. During his tenure, he has compiled a 53-33 record and his teams have reached the postseason three times. Payton was hired as the 14th head coach in Saints history on Jan. 18, 2006 after being a member of the Dallas Cowboys staff since 2003. In 2011 he enters his 15th season in the NFL and 23rd in coaching.

In this five-year span, he holds the top winning percentage (.616) for a Saints coach all-time. No NFC team has won more than the 53 contests Payton has won during this period and only four AFC clubs have more. His 53 wins are the most during any five-year span in Saints history and tied for the second-most by an NFL coach during this period. He's posted a 4-2 (.667) mark in the postseason after the team had won only one playoff game prior to his arrival.

Serving as the club's play-caller, Payton's presided over the most prolific offense in the NFL, leading the league in yards per game three times and finishing first in scoring in 2008 and 2009. These are the only three times the Saints have led the NFL in total offense. In franchise history, the Saints have scored at least 45 points 10 times. Six of these outputs have occurred under Payton's watch.

In 2010 Payton led the Saints to their second straight postseason appearance and third in five seasons with an 11-5 record, becoming the only the second Saints coach to post three double-digit win seasons. It was only the second time that the Saints had back-to-back seasons of at least 11 wins. The club had six road wins in 2010 as they had back-to-back winning records at visiting stadiums for the first time since 1991 and 1992. In fact, three of the top six road campaigns in team history (7-1 in 2009, 6-2 in both 2006 and 2010) have come under Payton. His regular season road winning percentage (25-15, .625) is tops in club history and the NFL's fourth-best over that period.

In 2009, en route to the Super Bowl XLIV title, Payton guided the Saints to the team's second NFC South title with a 13-3 record. Along the way the Saints set a franchise-record for most regular season wins (13). Their

16 overall victories were the most in franchise history. The Saints also posted the longest winning streak in team history when they won their first 13 contests. Payton was named as the top head coach in the NFL by numerous media outlets and recognized football chapters.

Payton scrapped the traditional timetable for rebuilding an NFL club in 2006. In his opening season, the Saints jumped out to a 3-0 record, equaling the team's win total from the previous year, and captured the NFC South title. New Orleans led the NFL in total offense, went to the postseason for the first time since 2000 and ad-

vanced to the NFC Championship for the first time. When 2006 came to a close, Payton was voted the Coach of the Year by the *Associated Press* and several other media outlets.

Prior to his final season with the Cowboys, Payton was promoted to assistant head coach/passing game coordinator and was responsible for the team's play-calling. For the previous two years, he had been assistant head coach/quarterbacks coach.

Payton came to Dallas after four years with the New York Giants (1999-2002), the last three as offensive coordinator after spending his first season as quarterbacks coach. Payton solidified his reputation as one of the game's brightest offensive minds in 2000. In his first season as coordinator, the Giants captured the NFC title and went to Super Bowl XXXV.

Payton has had particular success tutoring quarterbacks. Drew Brees has thrived since arriving in New Orleans, as he holds or has tied a total of 19 club records. Since 2000, every passer under Payton's guidance has thrown for over 3,000 yards.

Payton earned a bachelor's degree in communications at Eastern Illinois, where as a quarterback he had 10,665 passing yards, then the third-highest total in NCAA Division I-AA history. The three-time AP All-American selection had professional stints with Chicago of the AFL, Ottawa of the CFL and the Chicago Bears in 1987. Payton was inducted into the Eastern Illinois Hall of Fame in September of 2000 and had his jersey retired in a 2010 ceremony.

Born Dec. 29, 1963 in San Mateo, Calif., and raised in Naperville, Ill., Payton and his wife, Beth, have a daughter, Meghan and a son, Connor.
